Summer 2019 Musical Theatre Workshop - Program Description, Lesson Plan, & Schedule

Mission Statement: The Mission of Destiny's Call is to connect high school students, who are living in foster homes and are otherwise at-risk, with the benefits and worldwide family of Musical Theatre and the Performing Arts.

COST: There is NO CHARGE for this Workshop!

Requirements: *Students must register in advance, provide written consent of a parent or legal guardian, and provide their own transportation to and from the Workshop.*

Registration is currently limited to the first 50 students.

Services Provided: The services provided will include education and experience in Music, Dance, Acting, and Theatre as well as mentor relationships with experienced performing artists. The program is designed for high-school-age students. However, students of similar ages may be invited to participate, based upon their interest and likelihood to benefit from the program.

Summer 2019 Workshop Description: The Summer 2019 Musical Theatre Workshop will consist of classes, activities, guest speakers, mentorships, rehearsals, and a class performance.

Schedule: Classes will be on weekdays beginning Tuesday, June 18th and ending Friday, June 28th. Classes will be scheduled in 3 ½ hour blocks: 9:00am – 12:30pm and the 1:00pm – 4:30pm, with the afternoon block filling first. There will be a final class performance, which has not yet been scheduled. The specific class content will be customized based upon the abilities, skill levels, and interests of the students.

Location: The primary Workshop location is the Atlanta Lyric Theatre's rehearsal studio off Marietta Square. Additional locations may be added to serve more students.

Objectives - What Students Will Learn

Students will Learn the Following Performing Arts Skills and Information - The History and Social Purpose of Theatre, Theatre Vocabulary, Stage Direction, Stage and Backstage Safety, Stage Makeup, Costuming, Set Design, Set Construction, Choral and Solo Performance, Basic Music Theory, Vocal Warm-ups, Character Study and Development, Audition Preparation and the Audition Process, What is Required for Headshots and Resumes, Selecting and Preparing Monologues, Song Selection, Basic Dance and Warm-up (Ballet, Tap, and Jazz), Distinctions in Stage and other Performance Media, Lighting and Sound, Theatre Etiquettes and Professionalism.

Students will Learn the Following Transferrable Life Skills and Information - Character Analysis/Self-Analysis, Public Speaking, Team Building, Healthy Interdependence and Boundaries, Memorization Techniques, Active Learning and Notetaking, Posture, Diction, Vocal Placement and Projection, Correct Breathing, Overcoming Fear of Performing for an Audience, Giving and Receiving Respectful Critique, Self-Confidence, Self-Discipline, The Value of Diversity and Individual Differences, Creative Collaboration, Knowledge of Audio/Visual Equipment, and Basic Construction.

Long-term Objectives: Provide the highest quality education, individualized support, and inspiration for teenagers, who would like to pursue a career in the performing arts; Facilitate lasting mentor relationships between students and community professionals; and Locate 12 to 20 students who can become the performing group that will represent and publicize future work in the community.

Beth grew-up in Smyrna, Georgia and began playing piano and singing at a very young age. Some of her earliest memories are of singing alto with her grandmother in the choir of Vinings First Baptist Church, where her uncle, Howard McDowell, was the pastor. She began teaching in 1980, when she was co-owner of a dance studio, which she developed to offer classes in dance, music, acting, gymnastics, and martial arts at the studio and in more than 40 private schools and day care centers throughout the city.

In 1988, she started working her way through college as a professional entertainer and instructor. She performed for well over 100 conventions and appeared in stage plays and musicals with roles including Nancy in "Oliver," Maude Dixon in "Music Man," and Faye Templeton in "George M."

Beth received her Bachelor of Social Work Degree in 1993 and her Juris Doctorate in 1997. After more than 20 years of practicing law, primarily in the fields of Family Law, Special Education, Civil Rights, and Employment Law, she has come home to Georgia to care for her mother and is returning to work with her first love, Musical Theatre.

Patricia is more than a triple threat with acting, directing, and stage design credits in addition to her years as an actress, vocalist, classical pianist, and teacher. She was co-owner of a casting company in Nevada for 12 years and has taught students and directed groups of all ages – from kindergarten to senior citizens.

Her academic credits include a Bachelor of Music, Master of Fine Arts in Theatre, Directing, and Graduate Studies in Theology, Liturgy. She taught for public and private schools (K-12), community colleges, and universities.

Patricia is a member of SAG/AFTRA, the American Choral Directors' Assoc., and National Pastoral Musicians. Her performing roles include Lady Capulet in *Romeo and Juliet*, Hecuba in *The Trojan Women*, and Mama in *A Shayna Madel*.
