Services for Attachment Disorder & Autism



Orchard Human Services, Inc. is an IRS-approved nonprofit that serves children with Attachment Disorder and Autism including:

- RAD Reactive Attachment Disorder
- DSED Disinhibited Social Engagement Disorder
- Misc. Disorders of Attachment Development
- ASD Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Neuroatypicality including Aspergers and Sensory Processing Disorder

Orchard's services include clinical mental health services [counseling and behavioral therapy services] in additional to developmental intervention, educational therapy [non-clinical], educational programming and services, collaborative consultation, technical support, and advocacy and support for FBA/BIP, IEP, Transition Planning, and Section 504 Planning and implementation.

When children receive services for serious disorders of attachment and/or neuroatpicality or Autism Spectrum Disorder, the parents are actively involved in the therapy process. Parents participate in Parent-Child Bonding Supportive Sessions as well as engage in substantive training and support to promote the use of effective evidence-based parenting and behavior management strategies that address the needs of the fragile child.

Early in the process, Orchard provides parent training and support to address the unique needs of children with Attachment Disorder (RAD or DSED) and/or Trauma diagnosis. Included in our training are specific guidelines:



- 1. "That's Not Okay" is the standard response to challenging behaviors; unless the parent must use their voice forcefully to stop the child from a dangerous or unsafe behavior, all behaviors are addressed in a calm way. After using "That's Not Okay" write down what the child did and contact the therapist for support.
- 2. "Love and Logic" is a consequence-based parenting strategy that is evidence-based; parents are given a brief introduction to the concept and simple examples of how to apply this parenting paradigm to their child/home. Parents secure a copy of the "Love and Logic" book that corresponds with the age of the child.
- 3. Parents are trained on using Guidance Language and provided with Orchard's manuals for using positive guidance language called "Wholly Creative Communication"
- 4. Parents are introduced to the concept of Developmentally Appropriate Parenting [DAP] and provided with Orchard's developmental workbook called "What Children Need To Know"
- 5. Parents are instructed to reach out for help when the child experiences a crisis of emotion, mood, behavior, safety, or mental health; they are provided with specific instructions for how to access support to address situations as they arise. Orchard provides intensive real time support for challenging behaviors by Zoom, phone, email, text, and in-person sessions. Parents are additionally informed about additional crisis resources including calling 9-1-1, the local hospital emergency room, calling their child's pediatrician or psychiatrist, and the Georgia Crisis and Access Line.
- 6. As situations arise, Orchard provides focused support to help parents understand the meaning and causation of the child's upset, dysregulation, or misbehavior.
- 7. Parents are invited to synchronous and asynchronous training sessions about Attachment Disorder, Childhood Trauma, Stabilizing Foster and Adoptive Placement, Promoting Positive Child Learning and Behavior Through Brain-Based Strategies.



- Orchard presents a full-day training on Attachment Disorder that provides six-core hours of
 continuing education for licensed mental health professionals in Georgia; parents, educators,
 and other stakeholders are invited to participate in this intensive training that prepares
 professionals and caretakers for meeting the complex needs of children with attachment
